

AMERICAN INDIAN CULTURAL CENTER

AAITA has defined the redevelopment of the original dining hall of the Phoenix Indian Boarding School into Arizona's first American Indian Cultural Center as a primary pillar for the organization. The historic building would serve as hub for all tribes and their tourism outreach and education efforts. The building is located at the City of Phoenix's Steele Indian School Park, a 75-acre master-planned park located at Central Avenue and Indian School Road.

Cultural Center activities:

- The Arizona tourism experience, enhanced by the center's dual tourism programming: creating and marketing tours of Arizona Indian Country, and providing training for Tribal members to develop and manage sustainable tourism
- Revolving exhibits and audio visual presentations interpreting American Indian history, culture and contemporary society
- Traditional performances, lectures on American Indian topics scheduled, on weekends for the public and groups, and daily dining at the cafe
- Authentic Indian arts and crafts available in the gift shop where established and emerging American Indian artists will be showcased

INDIAN FESTIVAL

The Arizona Indian Festival (AIF) and Native Arizona Experience is an annual event held in Downtown Scottsdale in conjunction with Scottsdale's Western Week and the Parada Del Sol Parade. The AIF provides a platform to tribal tourism and builds awareness of Arizona's indigenous communities by creating an inclusive, inter-tribal event celebrating culture, traditional arts, crafts and foods, as well as innovations and trends in cultural tourism experiences in Arizona.

The 2nd annual Native Arizona Experience, a cocktail format event including tasting stations featuring traditional and fusion foods and cocktails by indigenous chefs and foragers, utilizing the very gems of flora and fauna that are grown and harvested right here in Arizona. In addition to the desert foods the event is enriched with curated contemporary and traditional art/artists.
